

Advance Roofer

Job Description:

Hands on knowledge and experience of all phases of roofing. Operates machinery and equipment. Management, supervision, material procurement and quality control duties. Driver's license not required but preferred.

Job Conditions:

Exposure to extreme sun, elevations of up to 50 feet, and heavy lifting. Flexible working hours.

Job Requirements:

Minimum of one year of roofing experience in tear-off, wood work and installation experience.

Experience with the following types of commercial and residential waterproofing and roofing systems:

Built-up, modified asphalt, metal panel, asphalt shingle, slate, tile, EPDM, PVC, CPE, Foam and Elastomeric.

Climbing stairs, ladders and scaffolding, and working at heights above 30 feet.

Workplace attire:

Blue or black pants.
Work boots with good grip/soles.
Supplied Affordable Roofing shirt.
Safety gear as needed.

Physical Requirements:

Lifting and carrying a minimum of 60 pounds.

Perform tasks requiring bending, stooping, kneeling, and walking significant distances between and within buildings.

Working in confined spaces. Working within Extreme temperature ranges.

Gross Body Equilibrium – The ability to keep or regain your body balance or stay upright when in an unstable position.

Static Strength—the ability to exert maximum muscle force to lift, push, pull, or carry objects 60 lbs or more.

Exert Flexibility—The ability to bend, stretch, twist, or reach with your body, arms, and/or legs.

Stamina— The ability to exert yourself physically over long periods of time without getting winded or out of breath.

Explosive strength—the ability to use short bursts of muscle force to propel oneself (as in jumping or sprinting), or to throw an object.

Manual Dexterity – The ability to quickly move your hand, together with your arm, or your two hands to grasp, manipulates, or assembles objects.

Performing General Physical Activities – Performing physical activities that require considerable use of your arms and legs and moving your whole body, such as climbing, lifting, balancing, walking, stooping, and handling of materials.

Handling and Moving Objects – Using hands and arms in Handling, installing, positioning, and moving materials. and manipulating things.

Getting Information – Observing, receiving, and otherwise obtaining information from all relevant sources.

Job Duties:

Equipment Selection—Determining the kind of tools and equipment needed to do a job. Cleans and maintains equipment

Operation and control—Controlling operations of equipment or systems.

Installation—Installing roofing products in which the manufacture or Affordable Roofing requires. Roofing worker who is able to install/tear off various types of roof systems, including built-up, composite, shingle, metal and spray polyurethane foam and performs hands-on work such as closure metals, woodwork, penetrations, and installation of roofing materials

Coordination—Adjusting actions in relation to others' actions. Follow instructions from Project Manager.

Mechanical—Knowledge of machines and tools, including their designs, uses, repair, and maintenance. Fastens composition shingles or sheets to roof with asphalt, cement, or nails.

Quality—Maintains quality of materials being installed. Identifies and removes/replaces bad wood and other issues that may affect the overall quality of the performance of the roofing system.

Cleaning—Maintains roof, ground, trucks, and overall appearance of job site and crew.

Crew— Supervises and instructs Junior Roofers. Maintains paper work such as safety sheets, daily logs, final walk through, mileage reports, and daily crew Production sheets. Follow company policies and procedures. Present a professional image at all times to customers and vendors. Perform other duties as assigned.

Rely on instruction, company policies and procedures to perform the functions of the job
